

Aside Replacement Windows that Meet or Exceed the 2009 Tax Credit Requirements

Updated 4-24-2009

The 2009 Stimulus Bill includes incentives for homeowners who replace their windows with ones that meet a tighter, new standard: All windows must have a U-Factor of .30 or lower AND a Solar Heat Gain Coefficient of .30 or lower.

All of our most popular windows can meet these standards if they are made with the correct kind of glass insulation. **ClimaTech** is our standard Low-E insulated glass with argon gas fill, **ClimaTech 2** uses two panes coated with Low-e and has argon gas fill, and **ClimaTech Elite** features a new denser Low-E coating and argon gas fill.

Other insulated glass options are also available at higher cost, but these are the least costly options that meet the new specs.

Homeowners may claim a tax credit of 30% of the cost of the windows they purchase, up to \$1,500 on their 2009 Federal income taxes. The customer **MUST** keep the sticker from EACH window that shows the window meets the specs. They may only claim their retail cost of the window itself, but not the installation cost.
